Some of our group preferred to stay closer to home as Amanda lit up her wood burning fire.





The wonder of snowflakes

Did you know that no two snowflakes are the same?

Here are some snowflake images.

A snowflake is a general term. It can mean an individual snow crystal, but it can also mean just about anything that falls from the winter clouds. Often hundreds or even thousands of snow crystals collide and stick together in mid-air as they fall forming flimsy puff-balls we call snowflakes.

The Big Bird Watch 2021

Don't miss out on the RSPB Big Bird Watch.

It's easy to take part and your information helps the RSPB to find out which birds have not been seen in your area as well as which ones have.

Here's what you have to do :

Pick a time

You can choose any hour between 29 and 31 January. So whether you're an early bird or a night owl, you can still take part.

Record what you see

Count the birds you see in your garden or from your balcony.


Ignore any birds that are still in flight. To avoid double-counting, just record the highest number of each bird species you see at any one time – not a running total.
